

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The 2020 season will be forever remembered as a season quite like no other. With all the usual preparations such as working bees, a bar upgrade, a premier squad trip to play Nelson Marist in their 75th year and our own 50th anniversary preparations well progressed, there was a positive feel and confidence around the club heading into the season. Then COVID19 appeared and changed the world almost overnight and sport, like most of our community and business activities, was placed in isolation.

The weeks that followed asked many questions of our volunteers and players. The vacuum created by the isolation of lockdown was a challenge no one could have predicted nor had any previous experiences to lean on. These were (and still are) extraordinary times.

But deal with it we did. New Zealand's best-in-class performance in dealing with the pandemic allowed communities to return to the playing fields and compete once again, albeit in a shortened season than usual.

The pandemic and associated lockdown had a significant impact on our rugby stocks as players became disengaged. Our inability to recover from this meant there was no colts' team nor a reserve grade team to support the premier 1 and 2 sides. However, MSP still had success amongst the six teams we did field.

The premier 1s collected the Swindale Shield for the first time since 2014 and reached the semi-finals of the Jubilee Cup. The premier 2 team lost their season opener before going unbeaten and winning the second-round Ed Chaney Cup and the U85s played a brilliant final to win the Tony O'Brien Cup. The ever-improving women's team made the top four but no playoffs occurred in that grade for them to progress further. Added to this, our first ever MSP netball team made the final and while just coming up short it was a resounding success with great potential for growth and diversity in our club.

Another highlight was the launch of Tim Donoghue's book *C'Mon Red*, the 50-year history of MSP. The launch weekend was a fabulous occasion and the book is an excellent account of the club's great history. Many thanks to Tim for his tireless work and contribution.

Fiscally the challenge is even greater. With a backdrop of ever decreasing funding the pandemic hit hard on our fantastic sponsors, and the withdrawal of WRFU funding for four months continues to put a strain on the club's finances. At the current time uncertainty remains around this commitment continuing. Whilst income was significantly down against 2019, there were strenuous efforts by many to reduce costs in line with the reduction in income.

Considering this changing environment, the Board has established a working group to review the club's operations and finances in a post COVID19 world. The task is to ensure MSP remains a successful and sustainable club into the future. This group will come together over the summer break to complete the review and form recommendations for the 2021 Board.

I must gratefully thank all those who continued their sponsorship, membership, and commitment during this extraordinary year. Your support is immeasurable in helping MSP

remain a force in Wellington rugby. The incredible work of the Board who work tirelessly in the background is something we should be very proud of. Also, to all those members and subcommittees a huge 'thank you' for keeping MSP going when I know many of you were in very difficult situations. It is all these people who have helped the club survive 2020, and we can draw on those experiences to remain confident of a strong MSP in 2021.

Have a Merry Christmas and safe (domestic only) holiday season. We look forward to seeing you all again in 2021 for our 50th anniversary celebrations.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 2020 Wellington club rugby season was certainly one like no other with the impact of Covid 19 creating an entirely different feel.

The pre-season began well and the players were all in good shape after several months of pretty intense fitness sessions. We were all ready and excited to get underway in late March only for lockdown to be enforced and the season to be suspended indefinitely. It was encouraging to see all teams keep the communications going and support each other during this uncertain time via whatsapp and zoom group chats. We even managed the first MSP Virtual Clubrooms experience on Anzac Day when a group of us organised a zoom meeting and enjoyed a few beers from the comfort of our living rooms.

During lockdown we were aware that the number of MSP colts' players had significantly declined from the previous season. It became a major focus to ensure that, should a season commence, we would have a colts' team. Unfortunately this wasn't to be and when the season eventually resumed on 20 June we had to inform the WRFU that MSP wouldn't be represented in the colts division. Part of this was due to the unforeseen impact of Covid but across most clubs in Wellington the colts division is struggling with numbers. It is one of our top priorities for the 2021 season to ensure we have a colts' team. It's long been a pathway to ensuring success at senior levels and we need to continue this by developing young players through the colts.

Players from all teams were pretty happy to finally get back into training and playing mode when the season got underway on 20 June. MSP welcomed several new players including Aidan Morgan from Auckland, Matt Dobbyn from Hamilton, Ryan Dafel from Nelson and Sagele Aukusitino from St Pats College. It's great to see players from across New Zealand making Marist St Pats their club of choice and donning our famous red jersey.

The premiers and premier reserves began their seasons in varying ways on June 20 against Norths at Jerry Collins Stadium in Porirua. The premiers beat the 2019 Jubilee Cup champions 28-5 in a dominant display whilst the premier reserves went down 10-43. This was their first loss in a couple of seasons and huge credit must go to the team and their coach Junior 'Tinkha' Tolova'a in ensuring it was their only loss of the entire season, culminating in beating the same Norths team 25-13 at Club Finals Day on 26 September to claim the Ed Chaney Cup.

The premiers continued on from that opening win and ended up claiming the Swindale Shield on September 12 at Evans Bay Park. This was a huge turnaround from being 2019 Hardham Cup winners. The entire team along with coaches Zak Feaunati, Edwin Meachen and Dan Kauraka deserve to be proud of their season. Whilst the Jubilee Cup semi-final resulted in a closely fought loss to eventual winners OBU, the season was overall hugely successful. The team's brand of rugby and their defensive commitment for the red jersey means we can look forward to the 2021 season with anticipation.

Congratulations to Vince Sakaria and Andrew Wells who both brought up their 100th premier games during the season, an achievement to be proud of.

The MSP women's team had a shortened season due to Covid. They played some great rugby across their eight games and achieved their goal of finishing in the top four. There is a real camaraderie within the squad and I think they too can look forward to the 2021 season with huge anticipation. Their passion for the game and support for the club is refreshing and a good example for all other teams.

The Covid-interrupted season also impacted the MSP Internationals, the U85s and our legendary Pressies. All teams represented the club with distinction in a frustrating year, with the U85s winning the Tony O'Brien Shield at Hataitai Park on September 12. This was just reward for a team that plays the game in the right spirit and has a great bunch of characters to make them a real MSP identity. The U85s were due to host a couple of social events at the clubrooms this season which sadly had to be cancelled due to Covid. But 2021 promises to be another exciting year for them and I'm sure we'll see them back playing their fast paced brand of rugby and ensuring we have a couple of events planned to rock the clubrooms!

Finally, I'd like to congratulate all our players who have been selected for representative teams. It's great to see and is testament to their hard work and sacrifices during the season. 2020 has certainly been a challenging and uncharted year for all involved. I guess it's a case of fingers crossed that Covid will be under control in 2021 to a level whereby we can enjoy rugby without limitations on crowd size and clubrooms attendance.

I want to make a special mention to certain players who weren't always selected to play on Saturday due to excess numbers of senior players and the fact that at the time we weren't in a position to field a second prem reserve team. These players who were rotated in and out of the prem reserves never complained and were always willing to put in the hard work at training for the greater good of the team and our club. I hope that come 2021 we can work to ensure we field as many teams as possible to ensure all players are playing rugby.

I'd like to thank all the coaches, managers and volunteers across all grades for their support and assistance in this challenging season. Enjoy the summer and here's to a successful 2021 season where hopefully we can finally celebrate our 50th Jubilee.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The 2020 financial year has been the most difficult for all sport organisations, and Marist St Pats is no exception. The Finance Sub-Committee has been working hard to make this a sustainably financial year for us.

With 2020 revenue at \$312k and expenses of \$296k (excluding cost of sales at \$28k) compared to \$389k and \$334k respectively for the 2019 year, we can see a clear deterioration of our revenue base in 2020. Even with the financial hardships we faced as a club, we were fortunate to post a \$19k operating profit (before depreciation) which continues a trend of recent years (before exceptional items).

The following are key items for the year:

- 1. Trust grant revenue decreased by \$70k. While we retained our very generous sponsors from recent years, Covid had a significant impact and there was no Trust revenue for six months. The club acknowledges and thanks these Trusts for their significant positive impact on MSP's financial wellbeing. Fortunately, the Trust revenue decrease was offset by the Government Covid Wage Subsidies and the NZ Sport Grant. The club also did not purchase any major assets this financial year which is another reason for the decrease.
- 2. Bar sales brought in \$47k this year, the same as in 2019. This is significant considering the convoluted rugby season. The Queen's Birthday launch of Tim Donoghue's C'Mon Red 50th Jubilee book was an outstanding success. The involvement from club members and invited guests at the clubrooms and at Evans Bay games was excellent. We thank Tim for his outstanding contribution. The bar sales turnover can also be attributed to the success some of our teams had on the field that translated into off-field celebrating, and Alan Woods continued his great work to increase the clubroom hire outs.
- 3. Understandably, sponsorship and donations decreased in 2020. The club is greatly appreciative of the generosity of our sponsors and donors. We were lucky to receive \$14k of jersey and game-day sponsorship.
- 4. The Shamrock Club membership event season and subsequent revenue was severely impacted this year. Membership income was significantly lower than last year, although this income is usually offset by Shamrock event costs. Due to Covid, the timing of the All Blacks test match in Wellington fell in October 2020, so the costs will be reflected in our 2021 financial results. MSP greatly appreciates Shamrock Club members' continued support, considering Covid's impact on the business community. We expect this area of revenue will continue to be impacted in 2021 and will do our best to support and promote our Shamrock Club members' businesses where possible.
- 5. No \$100 raffle was run in 2020. A raffle is scheduled for October this year with a plan for two raffles in 2021.
- 6. WRFU GDO programme income decreased this year because of Covid. Due to funding restraints, WRFU contribution decreased by 50% to \$20,000. WRFU is currently reviewing this programme.

7. MSP club membership subscriptions and donations increased. Even with a shortened season, restricted clubroom access and Covid related financial hardships for our members, they continued to fully support MSP and subscription revenue increased by 40% from 2019. This year, we used a variety of methods to communicate with our members and will endeavour to continue this next year. We cannot thank our members enough for their contributions and we are heartened by their support.

Marist St Pats wishes to acknowledge the following organisations and individuals who have contributed significantly to the club's finances during the past year:

- 1. Gaming Trusts: Four Winds Foundation, Air Rescue, Lion Foundation, NZCT and Pelorus Trust. Without their continued support, the club would struggle to provide resources and equipment to our players.
- 2. Various individual jersey and match day sponsors, who are vital in contributing to the club's overall operating expenses, in particular, our teams:

Dave Woods, Alan Woods, Peter Woods, MaryAnn Spillane, John Spillane, Reuben Ouwerkerk, Mick Sood, Porky Jensen, Spud Joyce, Kate Clapperton, John Poutawera, Chris Ryan, Ciaran O'Brien, Dan McNicholas and Brian McGuinness: these club members spent a considerable amount of their own time revamping the clubrooms including a major overhaul of the bar and associated equipment along with an upgrade to the lounge space (formerly known as the Kids' Room).
- 7. Junior Club sponsors.
 - a. Bryce Tietjens and Family sponsored the player of the day ribbons. Giving these ribbons helps teach our young rugby players the importance of sportsmanship and fair play.
 - b. In-Depth Builders sponsored our team photos. This allowed our young players to have a memorable token of their 2020 MSP season.

Again, on behalf of the club, I would like to say thank you to all club and Shamrock members, Gaming Trusts and sponsors for their contributions, especially during these challenging and uncertain times. Without your contributions, Marist St Pats would not be able to operate and we value your support. Lastly, I would like to thank Finance Sub-Committee members Brian Coulter, MaryAnn Spillane and Melissa Moroney, and Mike Hansen for their hard work throughout the year. It is your contribution that has allowed the club to operate this season. Your ability to make this a sustainable financial year for Marist St Pats is a tribute to your time and effort.

50TH ANNIVERSARY REPORT

(Thanks to the Wellington Archdiocese newspaper, **WelCom**, for this article, **'Marist St Pats RFC Marks First 50 Years With Glittering Book Launch'**. It was published after Tim Donoghue's 50th anniversary book was launched at Old Timers' Day on 25 July 2020).

Several hundred supporters of the Marist St Pats RFC helped the club celebrate the launch of its 50th Jubilee publication, *C'Mon Red*. The launch was part of the club's 50th celebrations and replaced its birthday gala dinner originally set down for Queens Birthday Weekend. Because of Covid, the dinner has been postponed to 2021 when events will include the gala dinner, Mass, club games, social events and the naming of a 50th anniversary team.

Singer Ca'ii Gordon very kindly sang the New Zealand National Anthem and 'Heroes', and was followed by guest speakers, Ron Evans, Brian Coulter, Brian McGuinness and Tim Donoghue. Also in attendance were Mike Savalii (Rector of St Patricks College), Brad Hudson (President St Patricks College Old Boys Association), Irish Ambassador Peter Ryan, High Commissioner for Samoa Leasi Tommy Scanlan and Mrs Scanlan, Rongotai MP Paul Eagle and officials from the NZ Rugby Football Union and Wellington Rugby Football Union. Family members of the late John Gordon (whose thunderous voice could be heard on the sidelines booming 'C'Mon Red') also enjoyed the festivities.

Ms Gordon, of Ngāti Porou and Rongowhakaata descent from the North Island's East Coast is used to singing national anthems to packed Australian stadiums. She was the Australian Rugby Union anthem singer of choice for Bledisloe Cup matches from 2000-2010.

C'Mon Red is a grassroots rugby story of volunteer attitude, spirit and passion exhibited by players, coaches, supporters and financial backers alike.

This is the third book that author, Tim Donoghue, has written and published on rugby. Tim also won Malaysia's premier non-fiction Book of the Year Award for *Karpal Singh – Tiger of Jelutong* (2014), his biography of the crusading human rights lawyer and politician. Tim's print journalism career has spanned five decades, including a stint as the NZ Press Association Hong Kong-based Asia correspondent in the 1990s.

Marist St Pats has built a formidable reputation in Wellington sport since its first senior team played on Athletic Park on Saturday 3 April 1971. The new club had been created late the previous year when members of the Marist Old Boys and St Pats Old Boys clubs voted to amalgamate.

The Marist club had been launched in Wellington in 1918, and St Pats Old Boys in 1926. By the end of the 1960s it was clear that, with both clubs competing for the same pool of players, the case for amalgamation was overwhelming. St Pat's College old boys Tom Blewman and Ron Evans became MSP's first president and chairman respectively.

The new club had its teething problems, notably over its colours. The first playing jerseys combined the emerald green and white of Marist with the white and light blue of St Pats Old Boys. It was a lacklustre compromise and in 1974, in a bid for a new identity and with memories of the all-conquering 1971 British Lions still strong, the club adopted its current scarlet jerseys and blue and green socks.

MSP today continues the tradition of the priests and brothers whose love of rugby was indelibly stamped on boys who passed through Marist primary schools and colleges. Many became prominent administrators and helped build superb amenities including the clubrooms at Hataitai and the gym and training facilities next to St Pat's College at Evans Bay.

The club has broadened its appeal in rugby's professional era and now fields a women's rugby team, a women's netball team and teams in the under-85kg grade to cater for players of a smaller build. Marist St Pats has a thriving junior section, and many boys and girls first experience rugby when pulling on an MSP jersey on Saturday morning.

Cardinal John Dew, the club's patron, contributed a foreword to the book and was delighted to receive a hard copy of *C'Mon Red* from the author. Cardinal John congratulated Marist St Pats on a wonderful milestone and thanked the Board for their expression of kindness.

The 2020 season started with an excellent pre-season programme with some intense and physical training sessions. This set up a good base for success in the upcoming season.

The team was then hit with the Covid lockdown which was frustrating for everyone. We had to wait before any plans were put in place for the season to resume. During lockdown the players were determined not to let all the hard training go to waste so they kept up their conditioning training which was crucial.

The season structure was changed so that all clubs played each other in the first round with the top four going straight into Jubilee Cup semi-finals. The 2020 premier squad make-up was good with excellent depth in most positions and with recruitment in some key positions, competition for places was going to make the team stronger.

The season started with a very good 28-5 away win against a strong Norths team in wet conditions. Then it was away again to Upper Hutt. Their pack physically imposed themselves and we went into the half just ahead but in the second the Red Machine got into its work and we finally ran away with it 61-11. Wainuiomata was next at home and we ground out a 27-10 win.

Then came Petone away, and as we know both clubs have had some fierce games over the years. Petone began with intent and put us under enormous pressure to lead 17-8 at halftime. In the second half MSP started to keep the ball for longer periods which resulted in points but we came up short, losing 19-20. This first loss taught the boys some lessons on dealing with pressure in moments where we needed to be more patient and also to start with the intensity that most home teams bring when you play away.

We went on to win the next three games against Ories, OBU and Avalon. Against local rivals Ories our forwards got on top and produced quality ball for the backs to attack. Ories came out strong in the second half with wave after wave of attack but the MSP defence held and we went on to win 42-6.

OBU were next on Old Timers Day. In our jubilee year it was a big day for the club and we knew we had to play well against a very strong OBU team. This was another great clash. Both teams were even in the early stages and as the game wore on we had a good bench to carry on that intensity. With some regular starters coming on MSP put OBU under strong pressure in the final quarter to win 22-18.

Avalon was played on a Friday night and with changes to the starting line-up this game was a great example of the squad's depth. It was a try feast at Fraser Park with MSP winning 92-14.

With confidence high and some good rugby played over the last three weeks we went to the Hutt Rec knowing we had to match HOBM's physicality. We started the game well but just couldn't convert the pressure into points and HOBM started to get some decent ball to unleash their dangerous backline. We were making silly errors and the game went right to the final play. HOBM held on after an excellent MSP comeback but we went down 22-24.

This was a hard loss to take as we had prepared well. But the lessons were that we needed to do the simple things well and build pressure against quality opposition.

We made a couple of changes both on attack and defence and went on to win the next five games against Tawa, Poneke, Paremata-Plimmerton, Johnsonville and Wellington.

The Poneke performance was one we played with high intensity and physicality, winning 50-18. Not very often we get to put 50 points on our neighbours across the road and it made up for last year's loss. Bringing back the Horan-Millar Trophy meant a lot to the players.

After winning the first round we were awarded the Swindale Shield, for the first time since 2014. It was an outstanding performance by all players involved and it showed the club's depth and the quality in both premier teams.

Next was a home semi-final against OBU. We knew this would be a tight game for the whole 80 minutes, with the winner going on to the Jubilee Cup final. Both teams came out with intent with both packs physically going at each other. OBU got on top in the first 20 minutes with MSP ill-discipline costing us and one player sinbinned.

We lost our 10/12 combination of Aidan Morgan and James Proctor before halftime which really tested our direction and attack mindset. With some key decisions going against us we needed to dig deep to find a way back as OBU were slowing getting on top. As the second half wore on MSP finally started to build phases and pressure. The bench again made an impact but with key players off injured the connection between forwards and backs wasn't what it should have been. The effort was there but execution let us down. Even though we scored at the end, time ran out and OBU held on to win 24–22.

It was a game we knew we could win but the loss of keys players throughout the game cost us. We almost did enough but fell just short which was disappointing. These players worked so hard over the year to bring the Jubilee Cup home.

We know we will come back stronger next year and are determined to win the Jubilee Cup but overall the premier season was a huge success. After last year, winning the Swindale was awesome.

The club's depth showed and the younger players didn't disappoint every time they took the field in the red jersey. The senior players led by example and a special mention to our captain Tom Martin for leading the team well this year both on and off the field.

Thank you to all the coaches and management for giving up their time and supporting all the players. Without you this team wouldn't have the success it had this year.

We are looking forward to 2021. The majority of the squad will be back to build on all the hard work by players and management.

MSP JUNIOR RUGBY REPORT

2020 was a challenging year for rugby at all levels and junior rugby was no exception. The level 3 lockdown hit just as junior rugby registrations were getting into full swing. It resulted in a number of regular events for the year being cancelled including the junior rugby club carnival, WRFU regional weigh-in and the Hutt Old Boys Marist inter-club event.

Once the junior rugby season was given the go ahead to resume post-lockdown, it was quite an intense lead in to get teams formed and prepared. On a positive note, the way the coaches, volunteers, parents and players responded was amazing. There was a clear appreciation of the opportunity to play rugby again and a strong sense of community spirit was more evident amongst all rugby supporters.

We were fortunate to have a 10-week season of junior rugby. Teams were given the opportunity to play throughout the mid-year school holidays and encouraged to adopt gameon principles to do so. We held two junior nights at the clubrooms, which were very well attended, and hosted Poneke in a successful inter-club event.

From a numbers' perspective, there was a drop in the number of registered junior players in 2020. We had 175 registered junior players with an additional 32 children registered for our Little Rippas nursery grade. The junior teams were made up of two x U6, two x U7, three x U8, two x U9, one x U10, two x U11 and one x U12 team. Unfortunately we were again unable to form an U13 team and U13 registered players were referred to other clubs such as Western Suburbs who adopted four of our own.

Whilst Covid-19 and the lockdown undoubtedly had an impact on our junior registration numbers, of most concern is the drop in U6 and U7 registrations over the past two seasons. In 2018 we had four teams in each of those grades whereas in 2020 there were only two in each, so we face the daunting prospect of having half the number of kids coming through the grades in future years.

The return to level 3 just before the end of the season was also unfortunate and provided further disruption and disappointment. It resulted in the cancellation of one round of junior rugby whilst the WRFU adapted to the Covid-19 restrictions. In the final two rounds some games were played under lights on grass pitches on a Friday night for the first time which proved a popular option in many quarters. We managed to proceed with team photos and held a well-attended junior prize-giving; however there was much sympathy for the U11 and U12 teams who had busted their gut to fundraise for their annual attendance of the Taupo Junior Rugby tournament only for the event to be cancelled.

I want to say a huge thank you to all the coaches, committee members, volunteers and parents for their contributions during 2020. Whilst the year presented many challenges, the way in which we banded together and responded to them is what I remain most proud of. It is that spirit which we hope to build on in 2021 to continue to provide a supportive environment for our kids to enjoy playing rugby.
